

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT TO BRING:

- Bedding: Sleeping bag or sheets, blankets, & pillow [single beds]
- Personal Care: Bath towels, washcloths, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, soap, deodorant, and other personal care items
- Dress Code Appropriate Clothing: Casual clothing is best—Shorts, T-shirts, jeans, and a sweatshirt. Don't forget to bring your swimsuit and SNEAKERS for activities! Please see dress code below.
- Extras: Camera, flashlight, notebook, pen, water bottle, sunscreen, sunglasses, bug spray, snacks are allowed in their rooms, fan for in room [no A/C in rooms; windows in girls lodging do easily fit a window fan].
- DON'T FORGET YOUR BIBLE!

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

No video game players, iPods, a bad attitude, matches, tobacco products, fireworks, alcohol, vapes, any kind of weapon including knives and guns, or illegal drugs.

CAMPER MAIL:

If you would like to contact a camper during his/her week of camp you can either send a letter to Whitehall [580 Whitehall Rd., Emlenton, PA 16373] or e-mail them at camper.whitehallcamp@gmail.com. Please put the camper's name in the subject line of the e-mail. Please, a limit of one email per day. Camper mail is given out at lunch time each day. Also a note: Campers are not able to respond to your emails throughout the week.

CAMP STORE ACCOUNT:

Once again this year, we will be offering the opportunity for campers to have a store account. Once camper accounts are ready, parents will receive an email to set them up. We encourage parents to set up their camper's accounts prior to check-in day by setting up their account online. However, if cash is preferred parents can deposit cash to their camper's account during the check-in process. Any leftover funds at the end of the camp season will be refunded automatically the following week to accounts set up with a credit card. Those with remaining cash deposits will need to stop in the camp store on pick up day to get their funds back. (You can select to have remaining funds donated to our Missions Fund when setting up the account.)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DRESS CODE:

Our desire at Whitehall Camp is to honor God in all that we do, including the way we dress and how we present ourselves. Therefore, we have a dress code that encourages modesty. If the dress code is not followed campers will be asked to change and if the dress code is repeatedly ignored, campers will be asked to leave.

WHAT TO WEAR:

- Pants
- T-shirts
- Tank tops (MUST have straps 2 inches wide)
- Shorts (MUST be no shorter than 6 inches above the knee). Shorts should not have holes all through them.
- Shoes or sandals are to be worn at all times, except in the lake, on the beach, on the sand volleyball court, or in the shower. Please bring extra shoes. Don't forget your SNEAKERS as they are required for activities.
- One piece bathing suit (if a 2 piece is brought to camp, you will be required to wear a dark T-shirt over it).

WHAT NOT TO WEAR:

- Spaghetti strap, tube tops, or strapless shirts
- Cut off t-shirts
- Shorts with writing on the butt
- Shirts that show one's midriff or are revealing, shirts with the armpit/side of shirt cut out revealing ones side.
- Shorts that are too short or have holes in them

DIETARY NEEDS:

During meal times, our kitchen staff can cook to cater to **gluten free, vegan, vegetarian, and lactose free diets** (Please note: we cannot guarantee cross contamination does not happen). If your camper has these special dietary needs, and you would like for the staff to cook to meet their needs, please let us know. There is a \$30 surcharge for special meals, or you are welcome to send your camper with all the supplemental food they need for the week. A refrigerator and microwave are available to your camper to store and prepare their food.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

CELL PHONES/ELECTRONICS:

We strongly discourage the use of cell phones or electronics by your camper while at camp. We understand there are special circumstances that arise which require campers to have them. To effectively navigate the integration of cell phone technology into the ministry at camp, we have instituted the following policy:

At registration, ALL CAMPERS (3-12th grade) must turn their cell phones in. Cell phones will be kept in a safe, locked room and will be distributed accordingly:

- **Senior High Camp (9-12 grade):** Campers will have use of their cell phones 45 minutes prior to bed.
- **Junior High Camp (6-8 grade):** Campers will have use of their cell phones 30 minutes prior to bed.
- **Elementary Camp (3-5 grade):** Campers will have use of their cell phones 15 minutes prior to bed.

If a camper has a device outside of the allotted time frame it will be taken by Whitehall staff and not given back until the end of camp. If your camper should need something outside of this time, please be reassured that we have your contact info and they will be able to call using a staff or counselors phone at any time. You can also call us at any time to talk with your camper and we will be sure and connect the two of you if you should need to talk with them.

PLEASE NOTE: Whitehall Camp is not liable for any damages, or lost or stolen electronics that are brought to camp.

VISITORS:

Parents, relatives and friends are requested not to visit campers during the week they are at camp. We ask for your full cooperation in this policy as it is for the well-being of the camper and camp.
